We drastically improved our work in reaching lowincome communities, increasing their representation in overall class participation by 99%.

We successfully launched our Financial Empowerment Fellowship, recruiting 6 young adults from historically underrepresented communities in the Portland Metro Area to serve as leaders in their own communities.




